Program of Studies

Montour High School offers a comprehensive curriculum within an exemplary academic program that is focused on *rigorous* and *relevant* learning opportunities for all students. MHS offers Honors, College in the High School, and Advanced Placement courses in English, History, Science, Mathematics, Business Education and Music enabling students to graduate high school with post-secondary credits. Graduation Requirements

Students must earn a minimum of 26.25 credits in a planned course of study. These credits must be earned in grades nine - twelve. The current credit requirements are:

Note: Students in grade nine are required to successfully complete a nine week/.25 credit online course in *Financial Literacy*.

Curriculum

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Calculus AB and BC, European History, Psychology, Chemistry, and Music Theory.

College in the High School (CHS) courses offered through the *University of Pittsburgh*: Introduction to Programming, Intermediate Programming, Advanced Programming, Website Design and Development, American Politics, Argumentation and Communication, Chemistry, Applied Statistics, Business Calculus, and Physics. Courses offered through *Robert Morris University*: Principles of Biology, Environmental Science, Micro and Macro Economics, Accounting and Finance, Marketing and Advertising, Business Management, and Hospitality and Tourism. Courses offered through *Carlow University*: Anatomy and Physiology. Courses offered through *Point Park University*: Sports, Arts, Entertainment, Marketing and Management Applications (SAEM).

The *Montour High School STEM Academy* provides students with academic pathways in both engineering and biomedical sciences. The engineering and biomedical sciences course curricula have been developed by *Project Lead the Way* (National Science Foundation (NSF) recognized).

The *Parkway West Career and Technology Center* offers students specialized career-oriented programs and provides valuable career training through apprentice programs and internships. **www. parkwaywest.org**

Montour High School offers over twenty extra-curricular/co-curricular activities to its' students. In addition, Montour High School offers over twenty athletic programs with more than half of the students participating.

Montour High School, located in the suburbs four miles west of Pittsburgh, PA, services the communities of Robinson Township, Kennedy Township, Pennsbury Village, Ingram and Thornburg Boroughs. Montour High School is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

The building principal and assistant principal are the instructional leaders for the professional staff which is comprised of seventy faculty, three school counselors, one librarian/media specialist and one nurse.
